

# Supply Chain for Langoustine

## Stage One

- Langoustines are caught off the coast of Scotland and are taken to Stornaway on the Isle of Lewis off the North West Coast of Scotland.
- The langoustines are frozen and are then transported via ship to Ullapool on the East coast of Scotland.

## Stage Two

- The langoustines are transported by road from Ullapool to the Southampton Dock (SO14 3GG).

## Stage Three

- The langoustines are transported by sea to Laem Chabang, Thailand via the Suez Canal (through Egypt).

## Stage Four

- The langoustines are taken by road to the Sahaphat Group Industrial Estate, Thailand.
- At the factory the langoustines are shelled and peeled by hand ready for the return journey.

## Stage Five

- The langoustines are taken back by road to the port at Laem Chabang.

## Stage Six

- The langoustines are taken by sea to the Grimsby Factory, UK via the Suez Canal.
- At the factory the langoustines are further processed and packaged ready for sale.
